0. Introduction

September is, of course, far too early to be thinking about things like the Holiday Season. On the other hand, you might be considering some sort of tech purchase for yourself at any time of the year, right?

This month's tech program will look at some of the tech — hardware and software — that is newly out or on the horizon for release in the next few months. We'll also look at things that the current tech environment might require of you regardless of what new gadgets you get or don't get.

1. A Perennial Need: Update Your Security

Malware is everywhere, and ransomware — as users of Onondaga County libraries hardly need reminding — is an increasing threat. You should have antivirus protection and general anti-malware protection on all your devices, and (most importantly) you should be practicing good security hygiene.

The good news is that you may already have (most of) the software that you need for maintaining a good level of safety.

- If you use Windows 10, then Windows Defender provides levels of protection that are competitive with various paid alternatives. Felicity Kay of the SafetyDetective blog recommends buying and installing Malwarebytes to fill some of the threats that Windows defender doesn't protect against.
- Macs don't have antivirus built in, so you probably want to get the paid version of something like Sophos Home Premium or Avast Security Pro for Mac.
- Mobile devices also need protection. This fact might influence your choice of which brand to get since some (notably Avast & Malwarebytes) cover mobile OSes as well as desktop/laptop OSes. Most software will also have an option (possibly for a few dollars more per year) that covers multiple devices rather than just 1.
